Fit For Purpose

Provide a good quality of life

★ <u>Cage-free pullet rearing</u>

Synchronicity between rearing and laying

systems Include dark brooders

★ <u>More space</u>

Max. 9 hens/m², preferably 7 hens/m²

★ Functional areas

Day and night quarters Well positioned perches and ramps Dustbathing & pecking substrates Include separate activity areas

★ Water and feed

Nipple drinkers for better litter management and less cannibalism Mashed food to reduce feather pecking

★ Free range

Good coverage - artificial/natural Provide shade and shelter

★ Animal welfare indicators

Mortality, incidence of feather pecking, feather cover, keel bone fractures and flock behaviour.
